Students and one parent or <u>legal guardian</u> .
When do I need to use my FSA ID?
When logging in to any U.S. Department of Education website, like fafsa.gov,
StudentLoans.gov, and StudentAid.gov.

Full legal name
Email address (if you do not have an email address, you will need to create one)
Date of birth
Social Security number
Contact information (current home address)
If applicable: old FAFSA PIN
